What is the National Ocean Scholarship Program?

As part of the National Ocean Sciences Bowl (NOSB) program's continuing effort to recognize individual achievement, the NOSB offers the National Ocean Scholarship Program. This scholarship program is to provide tuition assistance for NOSB students who have an interest in pursuing an ocean or environmental science-related major in the first year of their post-high school education.

Criteria for the National Ocean Scholarship Program

All applicants for the National Ocean Scholarship Program must meet the following requirements:

- Participate in the National Ocean Sciences Bowl at least once during high school career;
- Pursue a career goal in an ocean science or environmental science related field;
- Demonstrate academic success and integrity throughout their high school career; and
- Be scheduled to graduate high school in the Spring of 2024.

Application Process for the National Ocean Scholarship Program

Qualified students are required to submit the following materials by email (PDFs preferred):

- Completed application (available on the NOSB website under Scholarship)
- Official High School Transcript(s)
NOTE: If the student's GPA is NOT on a 4.0 scale, the student MUST provide a conversion to the 4.0 grade scale signed by their high school principal or counselor
- Official score sheet / results from either the SAT or the ACT
- TWO (2) required essays (see details below)
- TWO (2) letters of recommendation (one **must** be from an academic source such as a teacher or a coach)
- Proof of admission to an institution of higher learning (if available currently)

ALL components of a complete application must be received by email by EOD June 3, 2024 to be considered.

******NOTE: Students should include their application form, SAT/ACT scores, essays, and proof of admission in ONE email. The two letters of recommendation may be emailed by the providing individuals and official transcripts may be emailed by the school. Any applications with missing materials as of June 3rd will NOT be accepted or reviewed.***

Decisions will be made by the end of July 2024, and all applicants will be contacted regardless if they are chosen to receive funding. An outside review team of educators, university scientists, and marine science professionals will evaluate all applications. Selection will be based on evaluation of transcripts, SAT scores, recommendation letters, essays, and overall expressed interest in ocean and environmental science. Funding is dependent upon attending an institution of higher learning.
